2017 Summer Learning Opportunities

Our district is pleased to offer students who are currently in grades 9-12 in the 2016-17 school year a variety of Summer Learning Opportunities. Options include Credit Recovery, Initial Credit classes, and Enrichment classes.

Following is a preview of what is available.

Credit Recovery

6 Week Session

(Current Grades 9-12)

Students should consult with their teachers and counselors to identify which classes in which they need to earn credits. Students who work with English Language Learner teachers or Special Education teachers, should consult with those teachers first.



Physical Education - .5 credit

6 Week Session

(Current Grades 9-12)

This course includes units from team and individual sports, strength and conditioning, and fitness. Students learn about their fitness levels and wellness. Students will also learn about teamwork and sportsmanship. No fee



Health Education - .5 credit

6 Week Session

(Current 9th - 10th grade)

Topics include healthy choices and decision making, mental health, stress management, fitness, and weight control, drug use and abuse including alcohol and tobacco, noninfectious, and infectious diseases including STDs and AIDS, relationships, and sexuality. This course includes material on sensitive topics and thus parental involvement is encouraged.

Economics - .5 credit

6 Week Session

(Current 10th-11th grade)

Economics presents a crash course in the operation of a market oriented economic system and examines your role as a consumer, producer, and citizen. Students will examine current events and how they relate to basic concepts. Topics include scarcity, resources, economic decision making, supply and demand, and global economic issues.

Foundations of American Democracy

- .5 credit

6 Week Session

(Current 10th-11th grade)

This course emphasizes local, state, tribal, and national government structures and their roles in society. The course encourages active and positive citizenship by increasing students' appreciation of the tools required for participatory democracy. Students will examine the fundamentals of constitutional principles, organization of the government, laws, elections, and citizens' rights and responsibilities.

Traffic Safety - .25 Credit

Choose ONE 3-Week Session: 6/19/17-7/6/17 or 7/10/17-7/27/17

This three week course includes classroom as well as behind-the-wheel instruction. The defensive driving course fulfills the driver education requirements of the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles for students seeking their first driver's license.

NOTE: Students must be age 15 by AUG 1 to take the class; Age 15 ½ to take the temporary license exam.

No fee for classroom instruction.

\$200 fee for Behind-the-Wheel instruction
