

School Performance Reports and Data



Each year, school districts across the state are mandated to publish a School Performance Report containing information about the profile of the district, the students who attend, as well as data on several student performance indicators. The report is not as timely, as one may like, due to how the state collects and releases this data. The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has notified us that data for the 2009-10 school year will be available around May 2nd, 2011. As soon as the state releases data for publication, a district level report will be created and posted on the district's website within the Office of Assessment, Research and Accountability under "District and School Accountability". It will replace the 2008-09 report, which is currently on-line. The school district will provide a printed copy of the **2009-10 School Performance Report** to any parent who requests this. If you would like a printed copy, please complete the form on the bottom of this page and return it to school.

The district would also like to take this opportunity to inform you of additional information, which is timelier than the state report available to you. Each August, the district publishes a Monitoring Report containing a significant amount of detailed information relating to established district goals. This report can also be found in the district's Office of Assessment, Research and Accountability website under "District and School Accountability". The 2009-10 Monitoring Report is available now as well as reports from prior years.
