## Three Patrick Marsh Students Selected For Wisconsin NBA All-State Band

Alexsandra Rockman (7<sup>th</sup> Grade Flute), Joseph Rockman (7<sup>th</sup> Grade Trumpet) and Robert Rockman (7<sup>th</sup> Grade Percussion) have been selected to participate in the 2012 National Band Association - Wisconsin Chapter All-State Junior High Band. These talented young musicians were nominated by their director and will perform with the group at the Finale Concert of the 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention of the NBA-WC. The concert will be held at the Performing Arts Center on the campus of Wisconsin Rapids Lincoln High School, Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin on Saturday, January 21<sup>st</sup>, 2012 at 7:00 p.m.

The 2012 All-State Junior Band is comprised of 80 students from many schools throughout Wisconsin. Tim Kozlovsky, a well-known and highly respected music educator from Pulaski, Wisconsin, will conduct this year's band. All performances at the convention are open to the public. ## 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Solo/Ensemble Project



Each year the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Band Members have the opportunity to work on a solo for our second quarter Solo/Ens. Band Project. The solo is a great vehicle to help students achieve new levels of technique and musicianship on their instrument. Students choose a solo or ensemble, practice it, research the title and various components of the piece (such as form, harmony, contour, etc), create a verbal introduction then perform and **record the solo** for Mr. Gleason or Mrs. Haraldson during the week of **January 9<sup>th</sup>**. If a student earns a B or better on the performance, the student can then sign-up to perform at the District S.E. Festival on Feb. 11<sup>th</sup> at Prairie View.

The performance at the District S.E. Festival is not mandatory, but highly encouraged. At the festival, a WSMA certified adjudicator will listen to each student perform. The student will then receive both written and verbal comments. The performance will also receive a rating (1-5) that will be posted that day. Students earning a 1, 2, or 3 rating will be eligible to purchase a gold, silver, or bronze medal for their performance. The performances are not competitive (i.e. student vs student) rather, the adjudicator is scoring the student on how well he/she performed the music. Students will be responsible for the entry fees for all solos and ensembles. Students will be given the exact costs at their lesson the week of Jan. 9<sup>th</sup>. An exact schedule with your child's performance will be created one or two weeks prior to the festival. Please try to keep the entire day free, however if you have a request for a performance time (morning, early afternoon, or afternoon) then please note that on the registration form). All performances are free and open to the public.

Students will begin selecting solos and practicing them for this performance. The students will perform in classrooms located throughout Patrick Marsh at a specific time between 5 PM and 8 PM. The performances are free and open to the public. We would love to have family and friends there to support the students. Adjudicators will listen to the students and provide compassionate, helpful feedback about the performance. Students will receive a certificate of participation at the event. There is no audition for this band, just a signature needed on the application in order to apply.

The **WSMA Middle Level Honors Band** performs a concert at the State Music Conference in Madison in October of each year. Students currently in grades 6,7 or 8 can audition for this honors band. Students need to perform four designated scales, sight read and perform either a class B or A solo at the audition. It is that time of year when we get many emails and phone calls about what musical gifts we would recommend for your children this holiday season. First, getting them a gift that will help them with their musical studies is a great way to show that you want them to succeed. Moreover, it usually is a gift that they will use for many months and years! Here are some great gift ideas with this in mind:

- 1) Metronome/Tuner - all wind players could benefit from having one!! I recommend the Sabine MT9000Tuner/Metronome Combo-\$29.99 at Ward Brodt OR if you have an IPAD or ITOUCH buy them a metronome and tuner application!
- 2) Music Stand - all musicians can benefit from this. Cost of a wire stand from Ward Brodt is\$12.99 (Music Stand SM7122BB)
- 3) Subscription to Smart Music - online music program that helps kids practice and much more.
- 4) A year of private lessons with a professional on their instrument (see my website for a list of recommended teachers -<http://www.sunprairie.k12.wi.us/faculty/cpgleas>).
- 5) Upgrade clarinet mouthpiece and/or ligature. Models we recommend are Clarinet Rovner Ligature RO1R\$19.99 and the Clarinet 5 RV-13Mouthpiece\$89.99 at Ward Brodt
- 6) Upgrade alto and tenor sax ligatures. Models we recommend are Alto Sax Rovner Ligature\$19.99 and Tenor Sax Rovner Ligature\$19.99
- 7) An instrument stand. Yup, it will give them a safe place to put their instrument when they take a break....plus it makes it visible (meaning it will get played more!!) See prices at Ward Brodt.
- 8) New reeds for woodwind players is also a wise purchase! See attached order form for specifics.
- 9) Fun books with CD play a-longs of popular tunes.(see below)
- 10) New instrument - be aware of purchasing an instrument from Craigslist or Ebay! There is A LOT of junk out there. Please contact us if you need some help in this regard!!!

# **VOLUNTEER POSITION DESCRIPTIONS**

**\*\* All positions will allow you to hear your child's performance!!**

## **Kitchen Chair/Co-Chair**

- Arrive at 7:30 to help set up and prepare for the day.
- Post price lists
- Organize other volunteers for work shifts.

## **Kitchen Volunteer**

- Select a 3 hour (or longer) shift. Sells food, cleans tables, etc.

## **Door Monitor**

- Select a morning or afternoon shift. (4 hour shift)
- Check off performers' names as they arrive.
- Keep hallways quiet.
- Help judge know who is performing next.
- Ask performer for judge's copy of music and give to judge.

## **Door Monitor Sub**

- A sub is needed for the morning and afternoon shifts to relieve parents from duty when they want to hear their own child perform, or if in need of a break.
